#### **Practice Balls On The Course**

#### "Fore"

And while we are on the subject – it is part of golf etiquette and a Health and Safety rule that you should shout "fore" at any time on the course if your ball is obviously going astray – to another fairway. Even if you think you cannot see anyone who may be in the way still shout please. There have been some near misses reported to me recently and I experienced one myself a couple of weeks ago while on the second and a ball came over from the 15th with no shout!

#### Break In

You may have heard the bad news that we were broken into on Thursday 26th August. The thieves gained access via the farm road and travelled up the 18th fairway. Then they tried to break into several sheds before forcing a gap in the asbestos walls facing the road of the green keepers' shed. Some hand tools were stolen such as a strimmer and chainsaw. This is devastating news because we have been advised not to claim on our insurance since we are trying to build up confidence since the huge claim after the flood. We will be replacing the equipment gradually, but this, and the work to repair damage to the building is a drain on our finances that we could do without. We are now endeavouring to further improve our security with an extra camera and other measures.

#### Member's Guests On The Course

I have mentioned this before but it is still happening - so here goes again!!

**First point** – a guest is only a guest if they are actually playing with the member – otherwise they will be charged at the visitor rate for that day. If you wish to sign a friend in as a guest you MUST play with them.

**Second point** – guests cannot be taken on the course before the Proshop opens in the morning unless they have arranged with the Pro and paid the previous day. Otherwise they will not be insured to be on the course. Think of the scenario that a ball goes over the hedge onto Benefield Road and hits a car! This is easily done from a tee shot on the 11th and on the 13th. The consequences could be disastrous anyway but very expensive if the golfer is not covered by insurance.

#### AGM

The AGM took place on Thursday 2nd September. It was attended by 40 members who voted on the 2 propositions. You may like to know that the first one regarding the change of Management Structure was agreed in principle with work now to be done to the Club Constitution and the job descriptions. We would hope to have this work done in a few weeks and then perhaps hold an EGM for members to finally agree the change.

The second proposition regarding dogs on the course was not passed. In fact it came to light during the evening that as far as our lease agreement for the land near the lake is concerned we cannot allow dogs on that part of the course anyway. This is an excerpt from the lease agreement:

"So far as the use of the demised premises is concerned to manage and conduct the Club on proper lines and to enforce strictly the rules of the club for the time being in force which shall provide (inter alia) that all reasonable and proper steps be taken to prevent members of the Club their guests and invitees and other from trespassing beyond the limit of the demised premises and at no time to allow dogs and cats on any part of the demised premises"

All the minutes including the reports from President, Chairperson and Club Captain and the Finance accounts for the year up to April this year are going to be available on the website very soon and a copy will be placed in the Clubhouse.

## **Greenkeeper's Report**

During the growing season daisies and clover have become more noticeable on the fairways in particular on holes 5/6/7/8/11/12/14 and 18. These have all now been sprayed with a selective herbicide to get rid of the problem on the fairways.

The greens are continuing to be cut at 4mm every morning. During the month they have also been verti-cut to try and improve speed and consistency. The greens do grow a noticeable amount from six in the morning when they are first cut until mid to late afternoon when some people play. This does lead to slightly slower greens in the afternoon compared with the morning.

Rabbits have been targeting the bunker on the left-hand side of the 7th green. They are looking for the nutritious roots of the grass and the edges of the bunkers make an easy target round the course. We do have a local marksman who comes out and shoots to control the numbers but as we are in the middle of the countryside and they do breed like rabbits it is difficult to stay on top of the situation. We have filled in the scrapping on the edge of the bunker, laid down a mesh of chicken wire to discourage them from coming back then put down a layer of sand and seed. The irrigation has been set to hit the site show it should not dry out and get established quite quickly. In front of the 17th green has also been renovated.

Some of the other jobs that have been done this month that are not mowing related are- crossing points have been strimmed, bunkers have been weeded and topped up using leftover sand from topdressing, a sprinkler has been replaced on the 18th green, sleepers repaired that run alongside the 13th tee, hedge outside the pro shop leading up to the entrance has been trimmed and the greens have all been hand weeded to emove the daisies.

We have had a Jacobsen AR331 rough cutter on demo (there are videos on YouTube if you would like to see it in action). Its main feature are units that move from side to side. This makes it easier to mow round obstacles such as bunkers. An order has been placed for a new machine and it will be with us early next year. Our old rough cutter will be traded in at the same time to get money off the new machine, the same as you would with a car.

The work party have been continuing with their good work around the course. They have been concentrating in recent weeks on the hedgerows. Along the back of the 5th green and alongside the 6th tee have been done. Along side the 13th hole has also been done as well as the hedge at the entrance way. A special thanks must go to John Foster who has been taking away the benches from around the course and renovating them at home.
