

Operations Officer Report

Understandably, the depths of winter represent a certain amount of reluctance for many members to don multiple layers and confront whatever Mother Nature may throw at you to complete 14 or 18 Holes.

However, this quieter period does have its advantages. It provides a golden opportunity to carry out essential maintenance around the Clubhouse and the chance to embark on a deep cleaning exercise of the Bar and Catering area. Since the turn of the new year, this work has started in earnest.

Roger and a small pool of willing volunteers have set about a deep clean of the bar and kitchen and are well on track to bring both areas up to a more than satisfactory standard of cleanliness and hygiene. John Homer has done a great job in steam cleaning all of the soft furnishings in the seating area which was achieved with the use of a very efficient industrial style steam cleaning machine – thank you to Tony for the loan. Whilst we have use of the machine, the plan is to clean all carpeted areas of the changing rooms, corridors etc.

I am sure you will agree that Roger is proving to be a valuable asset to the Club, and we have recognised that his current level and hard work and commitment cannot be sustained. The Committee have therefore agreed to recruit a bar/catering person to support Roger at the earliest opportunity.
