The course

Summer is in full swing and this is reflected in some glorious weather. its best with fast and true greens, running fairways and demanding -but fair- rough. A real treat and a real challenge.

We understand we have had an increase in membership. The greens staff extend a warm welcome to new members – please feel free to approach us with any questions about the course.

Work completed

Greens are being mown daily at 4mm and ironed at least twice a week. Greens have been deep scarified. The badly eroded area on the 1st green has been renovated and overseeded. The 11th green has had early stage work commenced to enlarge the green. This work will be ongoing for the next few weeks.

Semi rough is being cut twice weekly and the outfield rough at least once a week. The rough in the copses is tackled when necessary. You may have noticed some of the areas of copse in the new land are being left as eco rough where play is not affected. This benefits nature and reduces expenditure at the same time.

Liquid fertiliser, soil stimulants, wetting agents and growth suppressants are being applied to the greens monthly. A slow release fertiliser has been applied to the tees and winter temps.

The hole adjacent to the 7th tee was to allow the repair of a burst irrigation pipe. All is back to normal.

Works scheduled

Work will continue at the 11th green to enlarge this into the apron. This will include top dressing and overseeding.





Contractors will be on site on Tuesday 4th July (weather permitting) to spray all the fairways and rough from tree line to tree line with a selective herbicide and liquid feed. The course will be closed from first light until approximately 9am to allow for this.

Routine greenkeeping will continue to present the course in the best possible condition.

Well that's it for now. Until we meet again.


