






### **Chairperson's Report**

Thanks again for the volunteers and the donations for raffle prizes. A total of £380 was made from both Opens for my charity, which as you know, this year goes for improvements to the club.

I have just spent £500 of it, to purchase seven new mats, for the winter, which you will see out on the course in the coming months.

A medal was held later in the month, with Ian Gilbert winning the first division with a nett 67. But going even better was Tony Shillcock in division two with a nett 60. A three shot reduction was applied to his handicap.

The penultimate round of the summer Stablefords was also held, with Graeme Eadie winning the first division on countback from Ryan Collins on 38 points. The second division, also with 38 points, was taken by Dale Abbott. The last round is due to be held on October 19th and with just 3 points separating the top three players it's definitely going down to the wire.








## **Senior Captain's Report**


We also have the first ever Poppy Day on Friday 11th








### **Greenkeeper Report**
