Chairperson's Report

What a joy to see the sun again and witness the temperature's first tentative steps into double figures. Thank you again for continuing to respect our Greenkeeping team's measures for protecting the course. With Spring emerging over the horizon, we will soon be reaping the benefits.

The club's Management Committee met in early February to discuss a number of regular items and few extraordinary ones. We received an update from the Greens Committee: course improvements continue, including the state of the bunkers, together with a general clean up of rough areas and copses. Equipment purchase plans were reviewed and will be rolled into next year's budget and a rolling three-year view.

A longer term view of major needs has been put together, including planning for the end-of-life of the sprinkler system, estimated to be within a 2 to 10 year timeframe. The preferred solution at the moment would be for watering greens from bowsers, using water from a bore hole that we have on the course.

The Greens Committee believes this to be both superior and significantly more cost effective than attempting to replace the sprinkler system. In the meantime, the Greenkeeping team will seek to get as much life out of the sprinkler system as is economically sensible.





Chairperson's Report - continued

On our financials, we continue on a trajectory to end the year with a small operating deficit of around £20k. Work continues on finalising next year's budget which, on a turnover of about £500k, will eliminate the operating deficit, provided that assumptions are met. The Management Committee's objective is to return a small surplus to enable continued course improvement and accelerate the reduction of the club's debt.

With regard to our marketing efforts, the early year membership offers have met with some welcome success. Additionally, we are putting together some pre-packaged sponsorship offers as part of a drive to raise additional revenue. And may I offer the committee's thanks for our members' excellent support of the MacMillan Quiz.

On hospitality, we are reviewing menu choices from the kitchen and will be taking steps to ensure that members are aware of what is available to them.

Finally, we will soon be launching a fundraising campaign to make the course more accessible (Handrails, upgrading pathways and walkways etc) - We'll announce more soon!
