## **Chairperson's Report**

The long hot summer has passed and we are now seeing a more normal mix of rain and sunshine. As I am sure is the same for you, I have been caught in a few downpours while labouring through rounds of golf over the past few weeks. As trying as that can be, it has been doing our course a world of good. The fairways are green again, the bare patches receding, and the tee-boxes softening. The greens continue to be excellent, as they have been all year.

On the subject of greens, you will likely have seen that the drainage work on the 15<sup>th</sup> has been completed. That the green was able to be put back into service within a few days of the work being completed was remarkable, and the light scarring left behind is gradually healing. To give you a sense of just how impressive this is, the large mounds of earth you can see to the right on the approach to the fourth green are made up of the spoil extracted from the 15<sup>th</sup>. (That earth will be used for the new yellow and red tee-box on the 5<sup>th</sup>.) The green will continue to improve as the greenskeepers top dress and roll over the autumn and winter. The early signs are that the drainage work has been effective and we are hopeful that the green will remain in service for more of the winter than we have been used to in the past. If success is proven by next spring, we will look to do more of this type of work on others of the most affected greens.

The management committee has met twice since I last wrote – on the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 30<sup>th</sup> of September. The Greens Committee updated us on each occasion. The new fertiliser and machinery store is almost complete. Work on the handrails for the path up to the 15<sup>th</sup> tee is due to start in October with a view to completion in December.

A proposal for improved pathways around and from the 2<sup>nd</sup>/11<sup>th</sup> tee-box have been put forward, together with a proposal for a few new copses on the right side of the 4<sup>th</sup> fairway on the approach to the green – this will improve the look of the hole and provide some protection for the existing white and new yellow and red tee-boxes on the 5<sup>th</sup>. The new pond on the 5<sup>th</sup> fairway has now been lined and it has been decided that the rough-grassed bund on the copse-side of the pond will be included within the red-staked penalty area. This means that drop zone relief (under a one stroke penalty) may be taken for balls entering that rough, rather than players having to walk back to the tee to retake the drive if their ball is not found.

Club finances for the months of July and August were solid, with results slightly ahead of budget and the bank balance improved year-on-year. The forecast for the balance of the year shows some pressure, however, so we are working hard on our costs management to ensure a continuation of the good momentum from last year. As I have mentioned before, we are looking to complete the year in surplus again, enabling us to further reduce debt and continue with course improvements.

Membership looks healthy, and we have had a significant uptick in junior members. This provides an opportunity for juniors-specific programmes and initiatives, and we are looking into the establishment of a new volunteer role on the Golf and Social Committee to spearhead these efforts.

We are entering the final calendar quarter which means that we are gearing-up for the budgeting cycle for the next financial year. As usual, we will be looking at our projected costs across all aspects of the club and reviewing our membership offers, annual dues levels and visitors' greens fees. Our objective is to provide Oundle Golf Club members with an exceptional and improving golf club, and excellent value for money. We aim to complete the process in January/February, when we will share the result of our efforts with members.

Finally, may I take this opportunity to express our appreciation to our club golf captains – Veronica, Chris and Colin. The amount of effort required to lay on a packed season of competition is huge and we have been fortunate indeed to have had the benefit of their untiring dedication throughout the year. Matches have been run flawlessly, we have been well represented, and we have seen plenty of success – well done and thank you!

#### SENIOR CAPTAINS AWAY DAY



Hi everyone




The pond liner has now been installed and filled looks very nice as you can see, this not only adds a good feature to the hole but also gives us the option to use as an exit drainage point for that area.
